DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Day 1 — Settle In, Chiado & First Night

Arrival day. Keep it light — get oriented, eat well, and ease into the city.

STAY

Memmo Príncipe Real

A five-star boutique hotel in Príncipe Real with a quieter, design-forward feel — 41 rooms, several with outdoor fireplaces on the terrace. A strong pick if you want boutique character over big-hotel polish.

ALT STAY

The Ivens Hotel

A five-star option right in Chiado with river and city views, a lively bar, and an explorer-themed interior. Better if you want to be in the middle of the action rather than tucked into a quieter neighbourhood.

KT NOTE

Which hotel fits you?

Choose The Ivens if you want to be in the center of the action with restaurants and nightlife outside your door. Choose Memmo Príncipe Real if you'd rather unwind in a quieter, design-led neighbourhood after a day of walking.

DO

Wander Baixa & Praça do Comércio

An easy, flat walk through the grid-pattern downtown grid — good for getting your bearings on arrival without committing to anything strenuous after a flight.

EAT

Topo Chiado

A relaxed rooftop bar above central Chiado with sweeping city views — a good low-key first dinner spot to watch the sunset without needing a reservation made weeks out.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Day 2 — Alfama, Viewpoints & Classic Lisbon

The most iconic day of the trip — old-town charm, hills, and the city's best views.

DO

Alfama & Miradouro das Portas do Sol

Start early while the narrow streets are quiet. This viewpoint over the rooftops and river is one of the most photographed spots in the city for good reason.

COFFEE

A local pastelaria stop

Build in a slow pastry-and-coffee break in Alfama rather than rushing — a pastel de nata and a coffee on a quiet step is part of the Lisbon experience, not a box to check.

DO

Tram 28 (partial ride)

Hop on for a few stops rather than the full loop — it gets crowded, so a short stretch through the steep, narrow streets gives you the experience without the wait.

DINNER

Chapitô à Mesa

Perched right beside the castle, this is one of Lisbon's most scenic dinner spots — especially worth booking ahead for a sunset table.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Day 3 — Príncipe Real, Food & Flexible Afternoon

A slower, more local day — design shops, a long lunch, and an open-ended afternoon.

BREAKFAST

A neighbourhood café in Príncipe Real

Start the day slow in this leafy, design-forward neighbourhood — quieter than Chiado, with a strong concentration of independent boutiques and plant-filled cafés.

DO

Príncipe Real shopping & Jardim do Príncipe Real

Spend the midday browsing concept stores and vintage shops, then rest under the giant cedar tree in the garden — one of the best people-watching spots in the city.

LUNCH/DINNER

A Cevicheria

A lively, colourful spot in Príncipe Real known for ceviche and a fun atmosphere — a good pick if you want energy rather than a quiet meal on your second-to-last night.

NOTE

Flexible block built in

This afternoon is intentionally left open in your plan — a buffer for a museum, a second neighbourhood, or simply resting before the final day, based on how the trip is going by day 3.

BOOKING TIP

Arrive early or late for A Cevicheria

This spot doesn't take reservations and the line forms fast since it's small and popular with both locals and visitors. Aim for an early lunch or an early dinner (around 7pm) to avoid the longest waits.

DAY-BY-DAY ITINERARY

Day 4 — Final Morning & Departure

A light final morning so the trip ends calmly, not rushed.

BREAKFAST

Breakfast near your hotel

Keep this simple and close by — no need to plan around it on a travel day.

DO

One last viewpoint or souvenir stop

Miradouro de Santa Catarina is an easy, low-effort option if your hotel is nearby — river views without needing a big time block.

TRANSFER

Airport transfer

Built around your flight time, with a buffer for Lisbon traffic — included as a note in your final plan so there's no last-minute scrambling.

KONTRAVELS NOTE

Leave more buffer than you think you need

Lisbon's airport sits close to the city, but traffic and security lines vary a lot by time of day. Your real plan will include a specific buffer recommendation based on your actual flight time and travel dates.

DEPARTURE DAY CHECKLIST

- Confirm your airport transfer time the night before
- Leave 2.5–3 hours before your flight, depending on traffic and time of day
- Keep breakfast simple and close to your hotel
- Save one easy, nearby viewpoint for if you have extra time
